## **Meeting Summary**

## **Unified Search Project Update**

The AO provided a status update on the Unified Search Project–an initiative to replace PACER search and reporting functionality. The goal of the project is to provide a modern, intuitive, user-friendly search interface, allowing public users to easily search across the federal judiciary for near real-time court data in cases, documents, and docket entries.

# Case Preview Feedback – Additional Fields Requested\*

Previously, the members discussed the feedback provided for District Civil and Criminal. The Group was provided with a quick refresher on Case Preview, a feature that will provide a snapshot of a case in the new PACER interface to serve as a more affordable option to view case information than viewing the full docket report. During this meeting, the members continued discussing Case Preview by focusing on the additional fields requested by members for each Case Preview instance. Members discussed the 22 additional fields requested and decided which to prioritize for the initial release.
